

**Town of Wayne
Mooring Ordinance**

SECTION I. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to regulate the placement of moorings on lakes and ponds in Wayne. Pursuant to Title 38 M.R.S.A. §7, the Town is entitled to enact ordinances to regulate the placement of moorings and other activities in its lakes and ponds and this Ordinance is pursuant to this statute. By doing so the Town expressly declines to adopt any other provisions of Title 38 M.R.S.A. §§1-6.

SECTION II. MOORINGS

All great ponds located within the corporate boundary of the Town of Wayne including but not limited to Androscoggin Lake, Berry Pond, Dexter Pond, Lovejoy Pond, Pocasset Lake, Pickerel Pond and Wilson Pond will be subject to the following Ordinance.

- No moorings will be assigned; it is the responsibility of the mooring owner to ensure mooring compliance with this Ordinance.
- All moorings will be placed safely and securely in a way that does not impede passage of other boats. In areas where there are multiple moorings all moorings shall be placed a reasonable distance apart such that other boats can pass.
- All moorings will be clearly labeled with owner's name, mailing address, and phone number.
- The Androscoggin Yacht Club Cove will have a 20' navigable channel. This channel will be clearly marked. All moorings will be kept a reasonable distance apart so as not to come into contact with other moored boats.

SECTION III. ENFORCEMENT

The Selectboard may appoint a representative to be responsible for enforcing this Ordinance through the administration of a ticket system. Violations of the Ordinance shall incur a fine of \$25 for a first offense, \$50 for a second offense, and \$100 for a third offense and each offense thereafter. Appearances in court may be waived by payment within 10 days to the Town of Wayne.

SECTION IV. AMENDMENTS

This Ordinance may be amended by the Selectboard at any properly noticed meeting.

SECTION V. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
